Energy Price Guarantee

From 1 October 2023, For the period of October to December 2023, the costs of mains gas and electricity will fall further, with the Ofgem price cap set at **£1,923** for a typical household per year (down from **£2500** last winter)

• This is still £160 a month for a direct debit duel fuel bill, up from an average of £105 a month prepandemic

This means that if you use the same amount of energy as last winter, it will cost you a fifth less



Financial support this winter

- Energy Bill Discount £400 for all SCRAPPED
- Cost of Living Payment £650 for those with means-tested benefits NOW £900
- Pensioner Cost of Living Payment £150 / £300 for those of pensionable age -REMAINS
- Disability Cost of Living Payment £150 for those with disability benefits REMAINS
- Warm Home Discount £150 bill credit automatic payment to those eligible (Requires a low EPC – households that were eligible are no longer eligible)
- Thames Water / Sutton & East Surrey Water 50% discount for those with a household income under £21,749



3 Key Areas:

1. <u>MAXIMISE</u> income, - check if you are entitled to any benefits, grants, or other financial support to increase income. This also includes any possible increased income from work.

2. <u>IMPROVE</u> heat retention, assess where heat is being lost in your home – are there any low-cost ways to improve heat retention? Are you eligible for any grants to improve the energy efficiency of your home?

3. <u>**REDUCE</u> expenditure**, assess what is using the most energy in your home – how can you reduce the energy use in your home?</u>

STAGE 1: Crisis Support – by phone

- ✓ **Fuel vouchers** for those with a prepay meter
- Emergency heating repairs (homeowners only)
- Emergency electric heating

STAGE 2: Medium-term Support – by telephone / home visit

- ✓ **FREE** small measures including 2 x LED lights and radiator reflector panels
- Room-by-room advice on lowering your heating bills whilst keeping warm
- Advice on energy and water bill tariff discounts including the 50% Water discount and the Household Support Fund (where available)
- ✓ Assessments for **grants** for insulation and heating works
- Referrals for benefit checks and debt advice via our Energy Max programme
- Advice on health and wellbeing services
- Referrals for FREE smoke alarms

STAGE 3: Long-term Support

 Dedicated team to support applications to the Warmer Homes / Sustainable Warmth grants programme – CURRENTLY CLOSED Who's eligible? Anyone in the boroughs of Kingston, Merton, Sutton, Richmond, and Wandsworth who:

- Is 65 years old or over <u>OR</u>
- Has a long-term condition or disability <u>OR</u>
- Has a low income (this varies depending on occupancy but use £15,000 per occupant as a rule of thumb)
- Is getting support from a frontline council or third-party service such as Occupational Therapy, Social Services, Age UK, and CAB
