




Welcome everyone to the Money Matters presentation

My name is **Lucy**, this is Rachel and this is Richard








Our groups support people with learning disabilities and autism to be more confident and speak up for themselves.

 - What do you think should be done?












During the project, group members have been

To start us off, we are going to watch a **short video** from Sense Charity, talking about how the **Cost of Living crisis** has affected people with disabilities






